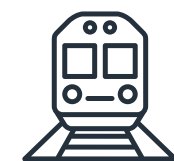

AMERICAN MUSEUM & GARDENS



The American Museum & Gardens is truly unique. Founded in 1961 to bring American history and cultures to the people of Britain and Europe, it is the only museum of Americana outside the US.

Set within a Grade 1 listed Georgian manor house on the edge of Bath, the Museum houses fascinating period rooms and a remarkable permanent collection of folk, decorative arts and cultural objects, showing the diverse and complex nature of American traditions, focused primarily on the 14th-20th centuries.


The Museum is situated within a Georgian estate of 125 acres of historic parkland, ancient woodland and formal gardens, with a gallery shop, café and Children's Garden. THE ROMAN BATHS



The Roman Baths, one of the finest historic sites in Northern Europe. At the heart of the City of Bath World Heritage Site, it consists of the remarkably preserved remains of one of the greatest religious spas of the ancient world. The city's unique thermal springs rise in the site and the Baths still flow with natural hot water, which once heated a sophisticated bathing complex where Romans came to relax and socialise. OVERVIEW

The largest city in England by area, Carlisle lies in the far northern corner of England, near the Scottish border, and is the urban capital of Cumbria and the beating heart of the Borderlands. A city linking two world heritage sites, Carlisle is a stone's throw from Hadrian's Wall, the northern frontier of a mighty empire that once covered the known world and the Lake District National Park where modern tourism was born, in the shimmering lakes and hushed mountains whose radiant beauty inspired poets and painters to turn nature into art. Explore dungeons and labyrinths at Carlisle's medieval castle, 900 -year-old cathedral and Cumbria's Museum of Military Life, all housed within the city's Historic Quarter. Britain's most impressive and important monument of Roman times, built by a force of 15,000 men in less than six years, it still evokes the feeling of standing on the edge of an empire.

Walk in the footsteps of the Romans and visit Birdoswald Roman Fort on Hadrian's Wall, next to one of the best-preserved sections of original Wall that stretches for nearly one mile to Gilsland. Enjoy the stunning far-reaching views over towards the Lake District Fells and take a moment to ponder life as one of the 1,000 Roman soldiers who lived there. Carlisle plays host to a packed calendar of events. Each Christmas the heart of the city is transformed into a winter wonderland with the annual Christmas Market. Experience the best fire and fireworks display in the North of England at Carlisle's Fireshow, and marvel at Carlisle 'City of Lights' son et Lumiere.

CARLISLE CASTLE - ENGLISH HERITAGE

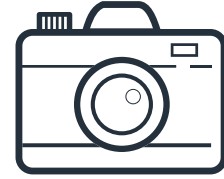


CUMBRIA'S MUSEUM OF MILITARY LIFE



Located within the walls of historic Carlisle Castle, Cumbria's Museum of Military Life tells the story of the county's Regimental history from 1702, through two World Wars, to present day. The Museum's principal collection includes items associated with the 34th and 55th Regiments of Foot, The Border Regiment, King's Own Royal Border Regiment, and The Duke of Lancaster's Regiment (Kings, Lancashire and Border). This rich history is told through a wealth of objects and enhanced by excellent audio-visual displays.


Come and see the French Drum Major's Mace captured by Sergeant Moses Simpson in 1811, learn how Sergeant Edward Mott was awarded the Victoria Cross in 1917, see the message in a bottle thrown overboard just before the D-Day landings in 1944, find out about Lance Corporal Ashley Irving's near miss in Afghanistan in 2009, and hear more of the stories of 'ordinary people doing extraordinary things'.



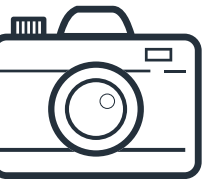

The Judges' Lodgings dates back nearly 400 years on a site that has been at the centre of Lancaster's history for nearly 2000 years. The current house was built around 1625 by Thomas Covell, Keeper of the Castle and famous for locking up the Pendle Witches during the infamous Lancashire Witch Trials. From 1826 the house became a lodgings for the travelling 'Red Judges' of the Assizes Courts. Dressed in their scarlet robes, the Judges decided the fate of murderers, forgers and highwaymen at Lancaster Castle.

Today the house is home to beautiful Georgian furniture by Gillows of Lancaster, elegant period rooms and the popular Museum of Childhood. Unfacilitated visit, guided tours, introductory talks.
