






WESTERN WONDERS

NORTHERN CITIES BY RAIL

There are 6 Heritage Cities in the north of England that can easily be explored as a self-drive itinerary or can be travelled by train with a Brit Rail Pass.

Day 1 - Chester

Chester is a classic contemporary city, which boasts the largest Roman amphitheatre in Britain, the most complete city walls at almost 2 miles long, and the 1,000-year-old **Chester Cathedral** which impresses with its stunning architecture and rich history.

Take a relaxing trip on **Chester Boats** a great way to view the city from its scenic waterways. For a taste of excitement, **Chester Racecourse**, the oldest in the world, hosts thrilling horse racing events. Or **Chester Zoo** is a must-visit attraction for animal lovers.

Step back in time at the **Deva Roman Experience** and **Grosvenor Museum**, where Chester's ancient Roman heritage comes alive. Discover the cosmos at **Jodrell Bank**, a UNESCO World Heritage site, or explore medical history in a quirky way at **Sick to Death**.

Shopaholics will love Cheshire Oaks Designer

For a unique historical experience, join a Chester
Viking Tour or a Roman Soldier Walking Tour to
truly immerse yourself in Chester's storied past.

Overnight: Central hotels include **Hotel Indigo**, **Moxy Hotel or the Queen Hotel** or on the outskirts of the city is **DoubleTree by Hilton Chester**



NORTHERN CITIES BY RAIL

Day 2 - Lancaster

Lancaster is a captivating city brimming with history, culture, and entertainment. The Judges' Lodgings Museum is the city's oldest town house, where visitors can learn about Victorian legal history. Nestled below is Lancaster Castle, a stunning medieval fortress offering panoramic views and immersive historical tours. Visit Lancaster Priory, a beautiful historical church or Leighton Hall, with its exquisite architecture and gardens, provides a glimpse into local aristocratic life.

The Lancaster City Museum provides a deep dive into the area's past, while the Lancaster Maritime Museum celebrates its maritime legacy. Or the Cottage Museum which offers a cozy look at Lancaster's domestic past.

For a touch of theatrical charm, the **Lancaster Grand Theatre** offers a diverse array of performances and adventurers can test their wits at the **Lancaster Escape Room.**

Overnight: Royal Kings Arms Hotel

Day 3 - Carlisle

The largest city in England by area, Carlisle lies in the far northern corner of England, near the Scottish border, and is the urban capital of Cumbria. It links two world heritage sites - Hadrian's Wall and the Lake District National Park.

Visitors to Carlisle will find a wealth of history and culture awaiting them. Begin your adventure at **Carlisle Castle**, a formidable fortress offering a glimpse into England's medieval past. Nearby, **Carlisle Cathedral** stands as a stunning example of Gothic architecture, while the **Cumbria's Museum of Military Life** provides fascinating insights into the region's regimental history. Or appreciate the diverse exhibits at **Tullie House Museum and Art Gallery**.

NORTHERN CITIES BY RAIL

Consider joining guided tours with **Discover Lakeland Guided Tours**, **Great Guided Tours**, **or Solway Connections Guided Tours**, each offering unique perspectives on Carlisle's rich heritage and scenic surroundings.

Overnight: Halston Hotel or a short drive from the city is Farlam Hall Hotel.

Day 4 - Durham

Continue your journey to Durham, with a visit to the historic Durham Cathedral, a masterpiece of Norman architecture, that stands as a testament to the city's medieval grandeur. Take a Durham Castle Tour which offer a glimpse into the region's storied past. Explore the Oriental Garden, devoted to the art and archaeology of the cultures of Northern Africa and Asia. Or visit the Historic Libraries at Palace Green Library which showcase rare manuscripts and offer insights into academic history.

Visit **The Beamish Museum**, known as the Living Museum of the North, which brings history to life with their immersive exhibits. For a serene escape, **Crook Hall Gardens** provide a beautiful retreat with their enchanting landscapes. Or **The Durham University Botanic Garden** offers a diverse range of plant species and tranquil walking paths.

Overnight: Delta Hotels by Marriott Durham Royal County, Durham University accommodation or Radisson Blue Hotel Durham

Day 5 - York

York has an array of remarkable attractions and to make the most of the city's many offerings, visitors can use the **Visit York Pass**, which grants access to 30+attractions in and around the city with one, two or three-day options.

A must visit is the majestic **York Minster** stands as a stunning centerpiece, its gothic architecture and intricate stained-glass windows captivate all who enter. Nearby, is the **Jorvik Viking Centre** which provides an immersive experience into Viking life, while **Clifford's Tower** offers panoramic views and insights into York's medieval past. Or for those with a keen interest in the past, **Whitby Abbey's** dramatic ruins on the coast evoke a sense of historical grandeur.

A short drive away, is **Castle Howard** which showcases grand baroque architecture and beautifully landscaped gardens, providing a taste of aristocratic elegance.

Overnight: The Grand Hotel

Day 6 - Lincoln

Journey on to Lincoln to visit the awe-inspiring **Lincoln Cathedral**, with its stunning Gothic architecture, as it stands as a centerpiece of the city's historical grandeur. Nearby, **Lincoln Castle** offers a fascinating glimpse into medieval life and provides panoramic views from its walls.

The International Bomber Command Centre honours the legacy of World War II with its insightful exhibitions and memorials. Or visit **Doddington Hall & Gardens** which showcases elegant Tudor architecture and beautifully landscaped gardens, offering a serene retreat.

The Medieval Bishops' Palace and the Museum of Lincolnshire Life delve into local heritage, while the Stonebow & Guildhall adds a touch of civic history.

Alternatively, The Lincoln Museum provides engaging exhibits on the city's past.

Overnight: City centre hotels include **Castle Hotel**, **The Lincoln Hotel or White Hart Hotel**.

SOUTHERN CITIES BY RAIL OR CAR

There are 6 England's Heritage Cities which are easy to access from the South of England. They include Bath, Salisbury, Stratford-upon-Avon, Oxford, Greenwich and Cambridge. These cities can be explored as a self-drive itinerary or can be travelled by train with a Brit Rail Pass.

Day 1 - Greenwich

Discover Maritime Greenwich in East London, home to Greenwich Mean Time and the Prime Meridian of the world at the Royal Observatory Greenwich. Explore Britain's momentous naval history at the National Maritime Museum and visit Cutty Sark, the fastest ship of its time. Visit the Old Royal Naval College, designed by Sir Christopher Wren, the architect of St Paul's Cathedral. Learn about the fascinating 600-year story of this site, the birthplace of Henry VIII.

Travel on the IFS Cloud Cable Car, travelling 90m high over London or for something a little different, experience the thrill of climbing 52m Up at the O2, with stunning views of London. Alternatively, explore London's famous sights aboard City Cruises and discover London's history with entertaining live commentary, taking in the best panoramic views from the River Thames.



Overnight: **DoubleTree by Hilton London Greenwich.**

Day 2 - Cambridge


Travel to Cambridge, packed full of stunning architecture and nature, and renowned for its university and impact on English history, education and pioneering scientific research. Take a walking tour with **Cantab Tours** where you'll find out more about the history and University life with entry into one or more of the famous central colleges. Book a punting experience with **Scudamore's Punting Company**, either guided or self-guided and include an afternoon tea, gin or champagne package.

Take a stroll around **Cambridge University Botanic Garden**, 40 acres of green space or join a guided tour and enjoy the highlights and history of this stunning garden. Or visit **Fiztwilliam Museum** and see everything from Egyptian coffins to suits of shiny armour.

Overnight: Graduate Cambridge, the Ibis Cambridge, University Arms or The Regent Aparthotel

Day 3 - Oxford

Journey on to historic city of Oxford with a history stretching back more than 1,000 years and only an hour northwest of London. With an Oxford Official Walking Tour visitors can explore iconic buildings, Oxford's stunning college architecture, cobbled streets, alleyways and uncover the historical and cultural significance of the city with amusing anecdotes. Alternatively, hop on and hop off the award-winning City Sightseeing Oxford open-top bus tour.



SOUTHERN CITIES BY RAIL OR CAR

Visit the **Oxford Castle and Prison**, a 1,000-year-old medieval castle, where visitors can climb the Saxon St George's Tower for panoramic views of the city or descend underground into the 900-year-old crypt. Take a trip on the River Thames with **Oxford River Cruises** where sightseeing tours, private hire and catering packages are available.

For self-drive visits you may like to explore out of the city to see **Blenheim**Palace for a tour of the Palace State rooms or a Winston Churchill experience.

Overnight: In the city centre at Malmaison Oxford – a former prison but now a boutique hotel, or The Randolph Hotel Oxford, a Graduate by Hilton or a little further afield at Leonardo Royal Hotel Oxford.

Day 4 - Stratford-Upon-Avon

Travel further north to explore Stratford-upon-Avon and the historic Shakespeare's England, which is the birthplace of William Shakespeare and a cultural town rich in unique offerings with award-winning museums and attractions. Visit all 3 of Shakespeare's Family Homes – Shakespeare's Birthplace, Anne Hathaway's Cottage and Shakespeare's New Place.



Don't miss **Shakespeare Schoolroom and Guildhall** where visitors can experience Tudor school life with Shakespeare's teacher, in the very room where young William was a pupil in the 1570s. Plus visit the **Royal Shakespeare Company** to see a show or book a behind-the-scenes theatre tour. **The British Motor Museum** is also worth a visit as its home to the largest collection of British historic cars in the world with over 400 vehicles.

A short drive away explore **Compton Verney** an accredited art gallery housed in a Grade I-listed Georgian manor set in 120 acres of 'Capability' Brown parkland.

Overnight: In the city centre at **The Arden Hotel** or a short distance away at **Billesley Manor Hotel**. Accommodation further afield includes **Warwick Arms Hotel**, **Mallory Court Hotel or Studley Castle**.

Day 5 -Bath

Head to the UNESCO World Heritage City of Bath where in the heart of the city centre you will find **The Roman Baths**. Here, the Romans built a magnificent temple and bathing complex on the site of Britain's only hot spring, which still flows with natural hot water today.

For literary enthusiasts take a short walk to visit The Jane Austen
Centre and next-door Mary
Shelley's House of Frankenstein.
For larger groups considering splitting in two and visiting both these attractions at the same time.



SOUTHERN CITIES BY RAIL OR CAR

Book an epicurean experience with **Savouring Bath** and discover the best of the city's food and drink scene, from markets and restaurants to 18th century buns, modern patisseries, artisanal coffee and unusual tea. Alternatively, in a Georgian manor house on the edge of the city, explore the **American Museum & Gardens** with their remarkable collection of folk, decorative arts and cultural objects, showcasing American traditions from 14th - 20th Centuries.

Overnight: Abbey Hotel, Brooks Guesthouse, Hampton by Hilton Bath City or YMCA Bath.

Day 6 - Salisbury

Continue onwards to visit the medieval city of Salisbury. At the city's heart is Salisbury Cathedral, Britain's finest 13th century cathedral with the tallest spire in Britain, the world's oldest working clock (1386) and the world's best-preserved original Magna Carta (1215). In the famous Cathedral Close, visitors can explore many attractions including Mompesson House and Salisbury Museum. Stop for a coffee and refreshments at Fisherton Mill – an old 1880 grain mill and now England's largest independent gallery and award-winning café and artist studios.

Don't miss a visit to the magnificent stones and visitor centre at

Stonehenge. The Stonehenge Tour

Bus runs regular services from the centre of Salisbury and the railway station to the visitor centre. The bus includes a recorded audio commentary and there is an inclusive bus and Stonehenge admission price.



Overnight: In the city centre at the Mercure White Hart Hotel, Legacy Rose & Crown Hotel, or Milford Hall Hotel. Or travel to the outskirts for Holiday Inn Salisbury Stonehenge or The Stones Hotel.

For self-drive visitors, consider exploring nearby destinations including Pewsey, Hungerford, Reading, Windsor and Richmond on-route back to London.

OVERVIEW

Built for pleasure and relaxation, Bath has been a wellbeing destination since Roman times. Discover the ancient Roman Baths and the thoroughly modern Thermae Bath Spa, which houses the only natural thermal hot springs in Britain that you can bathe in. Bath's compact, visitor-friendly centre is overflowing with places to eat and drink, plus some of the finest independent shops in Britain. Immerse yourself in Bath's remarkable collection of gardens, museums and galleries, and enjoy year-round exhibitions, festivals, theatre, music, and sports.

To be surrounded by Bath's stunning honey-coloured Georgian architecture feels like being at the centre of a Jane Austen novel, or a film set. It's hardly surprising the city is so often seen on screen, including Bridgerton and tours take you to explore these locations. The city is a UNESCO World Heritage site, and one of the UNESCO Great Spa Towns of Europe giving it a rare double designation. Its incredible architecture offers stunning heritage boutique hotels, five-star splendour and cosy guesthouses, as well as global brands. As well as award winning restaurants, there are a plenty of local specialities to discover with breweries, distilleries, vineyards, cheesemakers, and the famous Sally Lunn Bunn. Bath is the perfect base to explore the beautiful surrounds of the Chew Valley, Cotswolds, Somerset, and Wiltshire market towns.

AMERICAN MUSEUM & GARDENS









Set within a Grade 1 listed Georgian manor house on the edge of Bath, the Museum houses fascinating period rooms and a remarkable permanent collection of folk, decorative arts and cultural objects, showing the diverse and complex nature of American traditions, focused primarily on the 14th-20th centuries. The venue also hosts a range of themed temporary exhibitions.

The Museum is situated within a Georgian estate of 125 acres of historic parkland, ancient woodland and formal gardens recognised by the Royal Horticultural Society, with a gallery shop, American Garden Deli café, and Children's Garden. Located opposite the beautiful Limpley Stoke Valley, the views from the gardens and American Deli terrace are spectacular.

THE ROMAN BATHS









The Roman Baths is one of the finest historic sites in Northern Europe.

Once one of the great religious spas of the ancient world, people travelled from the far corners of the Roman Empire to visit the Baths, to worship the goddess Sulis Minerva and to bathe in the waters of the natural thermal springs, which still flow with hot water today.

2000 years later visitors still flock to this site to visit the remains of the Bathing complex, including the iconic Great Bath, and to discover more about the people of Roman Britain through the items they left behind, now on display in the museum. Advance booking is essential and must be made at least two working days in advance. Audio-guides (included in the cost of admission) are available in 12 languages.



















IN AND BEYOND BATH




With its mix of great places to eat and drink, a castle and museums, impressive theatre and some fantastic events, Lancaster is a city which is well worth exploring for a group visit. History runs through the quaint cobbled streets, where you'll find a coffee shop dating back to 1837, a restaurant housed in a 300-year-old former wine merchant's cellar and Lancaster's oldest pub which dates to the 15th century and is one of only two sites in Britain with an original gravity-fed cellar. There is also a huge selection of independent cafés and restaurants, many catering for groups and serving specialist foods.

Whenever you choose to visit, you'll be delighted with the evening entertainment available to group organisers with plays, musicals and shows at The Dukes and the Grand Theatre. The Dukes' annual Play in the Park is a large-scale walkabout performance in Williamson Park and is a must-see during the summer months. Lancaster Arts at Lancaster University also offers theatre and dance, concerts and music events and a public art gallery.





JUDGES' LODGINGS MUSEUM









Bringing the stories of Lancaster to life for everyone, through the city's oldest town house. Nestled below Lancaster Castle,

The Judges' Lodgings dates back nearly 400 years on a site that has been at the centre of Lancaster's history for nearly 2000 years. The current house was built around 1625 by Thomas Covell, Keeper of the Castle and famous for locking up the Pendle Witches during the infamous Lancashire Witch Trials. From 1826 the house became a lodgings for the travelling 'Red Judges' of the Assizes Courts. Dressed in their scarlet robes, the Judges decided the fate of murderers, forgers and highwaymen at Lancaster Castle.

Today the house is home to beautiful Georgian furniture by Gillows of Lancaster, elegant period rooms and the popular Museum of Childhood. Unfacilitated visit, guided tours, introductory talks.



Discover the story of Lancaster and Morecambe's relationship with the ocean, the challenging lives of those living and working in the places between land and sea, and how our inland waterways have shaped our lives, work, and leisure. We uncover the dark legacy that the transatlantic slave trade has left in this proud, historic city and show how the Quay where the museum stands was once a bustling place of trade and commerce from all over the world.

Lancaster Maritime Museum occupies two historic buildings on St. George's Quay, the heart of the city's 18th-century harbour. The museum was opened in 1985 in the former Custom House, designed in 1764 by Richard Gillow. It also incorporates the upper floor of the neighbouring warehouse, where goods were stored after being shipped into the port from all over the world.

Explore these atmospheric and fascinating buildings and discover the history of the Port of Lancaster. Experience the treacherous crossing of the sands, sit in a packet boat on the Lancaster Canal, and listen to local fisherfolk speak of life on and around Morecambe Bay. Delve into Lancaster's darker side and learn the stories of the merchant families who built the city's wealth from the trade in enslaved Africans and slave-produced goods, or discover something new in our programme of changing exhibitions.
